Great Britain and the United States are the last major nations of the world who attach any sanctity or honor ational to a treaty or commitment, no matter how solemnly entered into. Her war against Finland was as merciless and yet as unprovoked as any in the history of mankind. Her communist dictatorship is just as ruthless, absolute, and ungodly as Hitler's could possibly be. She has aided and participated in Germany's

when we cool-headily analyze the situation, we must recognize that Hitler's armies constitute the most dangerous external threat to the United States. If we could hope that Communism and Naziism would devour each other in this conflict, then we might feel that if thereever was a good war, this fight between Russia and Germany was it. We must not let our intense loathing of communism get our eyes off the ball. If Germany can destroy the Russian army and gain control of her

natural resources and productive capacity, according to the Hitler time-table, then he will be a more serious threat than he is now If, on the other hand, Russia can keep armies engaged until the United States and Great Britain become fully prepared to resist any possible onslaught, then we have could gained the time which is so precious and necessary to our welfare. This is the WW principal reason we have aided Great Britain. This is the principal reason we have pledged aid to other countries fighting the spread of the war. This is the principal reason why President Roosevelt and Princ Minister Churchill pledged The form of aid to Russia. Practically, our greatest aid to Russia must be in greater aid to Great Britain. Of course, the President released the Russian assets which had been frozen in this country. He gave her political and moral encouragement by his announcement. He declined to put Russia's Pacific ports under the band of the neutrality act; and there will be further economic concessions. Nevertheless, it must be remembered that we are giving insufficient aid to Great Britain, and that our own army is not fully equiped. Military men say the most effective way Great Britain can help Russia is to launch an attack, which she is now doing by air, upon Germany in the West to prevent all of Germany's forces from being concentrated on Russia in the East.

If we could now provide Great Britain with all of the bombers she needs and all the amunition she needs, Great Britain could visit tremendous devastation upon Germany's industrial and military establishments. Another enigma is the shipping problem. We had ample supplies for both Great Britain and Russia, it would be a difficult task indeed to get it there. So the prevailing opinion in Washington is that even though the President has pledged aid to Russia, in

practical effect, aside from economic cooperation, the bulk of that aid will be in the form of greater aid to Great Britain.

This unexpected war between Russia and Germany has given Great Britain

a breathing spell. It has given America a break in time. It has given her a

better opportunity to get prepared.) To take advantage of that opportunity, we

should and must put every shoulder to the wheel and arm and arm and arm. We

must defend ourselves against these forces of barbarism. If these nations, and in

this respect, Russia is just as bad as Germany, who have no regard for honor, who,
